

WEST OF SCOTLAND BREAST SCREENING SERVICE

Frequently asked questions

- 1. A women informs you that she has been given an appointment that does not suit. Ask her to contact the centre to re-arrange a suitable appointment.
- A women becomes 50 years of age and asks if she can be screened. Her practice was screened earlier in the year.
 She can be screened up to 6 months before we are due to be back in her practice. Ask her to contact the centre to arrange a suitable appointment.
- **3.** A 50 year old women asks about screening. Her practice is due to be screened within 3 months time.

If her practice is going to be screened within the next 6 months, ask her to wait until she is called automatically with her practice. This will keep her in line with the rest of her practice.

- 4. A women over the age of 71 wishes to be screened. *Certain people can self-refer for breast screening. If you're aged over 71 you can now self refer for a breast screening appointment. To self-refer, contact your local breast screening centre.*
- 5. A women tells you that she has discovered a breast lump. She is 56 years old. *Explain to her that we are not a symptomatic service and she should make an appointment with her GP as soon as possible.*
- A 60 year old women tells you she has been screened 3 times and has always had a normal result. She doesn't want to attend this time.
 Encourage her to attend and explain to her that breast cancer increases with age.
- A women is 60 years old and has received an invitation for screening to the <u>mobile unit</u>. She is unable to climb the stairs. The women may or may not use a wheelchair.
 Ask her to contact the centre even is she has attended previously to ensure we provide adequate time for her appointment. <u>Electric Wheelchairs</u> cannot be accomodated on the mobile units.
- 8. A women asks whether she should attend for screening as she has implants.

Yes, she should still attend for her screening but should also contact the centre to inform us when she receives her appointment to ensure adequate time for her appointment.

N.B. West of Scotland Breast Screening Service is not a referral service. Invitations are automatically sent out to women provided they are between 50-70 years of age.

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
